Our doors opened in August of 2001 with 350 students. Currently, Mountain Vista has approximately 2340 students. We are a traditional, comprehensive public high school with a strong college preparatory program that serves grades 9-12. The 176-day school calendar is comprised of two 18-week semesters.

We have consistently achieved “Excellent” ratings in our overall academic performance. Mountain Vista High School has exceeded or met all performance criteria on Colorado’s School Performance Framework with outstanding annual ratings in Academic Achievement along with top scores in the Postsecondary and Work Force Readiness Indicator.

## Activities and Athletics

**The Arts:** Mountain Vista provides many opportunities for students to express themselves in our fine arts and performing arts programs. **Sports:** There are 24 athletic teams that compete at the varsity level while maintaining high academic standards.
